THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA GLOBAL CAMPUS TRANSFER GUIDELINES

- For students to receive transfer credit for DSST exams, students are responsible for having an official DSST transcript sent to Global Campus. Official transfer credit evaluation takes place once a student is enrolled at Global Campus and all official transcripts have been received.
- Credit will only be considered if the student successfully passes the exam with the ACE recommended passing score.
- Exams worth 3 credits may meet multiple subject areas or courses but can only be applied to once. Exams worth 6 credits may meet multiple subject areas or courses but can only be applied for up to two areas.
- Multiple courses may meet a General Education requirement, however only one course is needed to satisfy the requirement.
- Courses being transferred to meet the Information Literacy Core Competency, the Digital Literacy requirement, or any computer-specific course must have been taken within the last 5 years.
- Lower-for-Upper transfer credits may be applied to fulfill equivalent course subjects. These credits will not apply to any Upper-Division requirement. Additional Upper Division courses may be required.
- A maximum of 75 credits of non-traditional credit, may be applied toward degree completion (depending on student's state of residence). For state specific information, please refer to the [Undergraduate General Transfer Credit Provisions and Limitations](#) in the Global Campus catalog.
